Robert Fastiggi, Ph.D. is Professor of Systematic Theology at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit, MI. USA where he's been since 1999. From 1985–1999, he taught at St. Edward's University in Austin, Texas. He holds an A.B. from Dartmouth College and a M.A. and Ph.D. in Theology from Fordham University. He and his wife, Kathleen, have been married since 1984 and are parents of three children: Mary, Anthony, and Clare.



Dr. Bobby Lee is a Dearborn, MI physician who specializes in hospice and palliative medicine (end-of-life care and serious illness). Before completing his residency at the University of Kansas Medical Center, Dr. Lee attended medical school at the University of Kansas School of Medicine and the University of Kentucky College of Medicine. He is board certified in Internal Medicine and Hospice/Palliative Medicine. His professional affiliations include Oakwood Healthcare and Garden City Hospital.



Ed Rivet is the Legislative Director for Right to Life of Michigan, serving as the liaison between Right to Life and Michigan's state government. He holds a bachelor's and master's degree from Michigan State University. In the 1990's Ed served as a member of the legislatively-appointed Michigan Commission on Death and Dying, and debated the likes of Geoffrey Fieger and Derek Humphrey during the lethal escapades of Jack Kevorkian. Ed has shared his expertise on life issues through the many articles he has published, presentations made at national level conferences, and countless media interviews, including The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, CNN and Good Morning America.
